COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION MEETING MINUTES JUNE 15, 2011

Meeting called to order by President Kathy Boettcher at 6:10 pm. Boettcher also volunteered to take the minutes as secretary Lani Gossett was not present.

The guest speakers for the 9 HEALTH FAIR could not attend and had to postpone their presentation until the September meeting.

Carol reported that if someone goes to the County Board of Commissioners meetings, they should check the website for their agenda to see if anything of relevance to the Guffey area is under discussion.

Carol also reported on the county code for outdoor light shading and that the county maintenance building in Guffey needed to comply with the code. They had until June 10th to shade the light. If they hadn't responded by the 10th, the county attorney would send them a letter. If they don't comply it could cost them \$100/day fine until they do shade the light. They seem to think the code does not apply to a county building.

Carol then reported on the June meeting in Victor about the Ft. Carson air operations over the area. Carol was the only person there from Guffey. See Carol's notes from the meeting attached.

It was suggested that a copy of Carol's notes be posted at Rita's as well as the website.

It was suggested that we have the republican and democrat representatives from the central committees come and talk about the caucus process for the next meeting.

Don Davis then gave a brief report about the RE-2 school board meeting on 6/9/11. He said that the mass group from Guffey embarrassed him with their out of place and rude name calling addressed to Dr. Amy Mason. Mason had brought to the attention of the RE-2 board, of which she is a member, what she believed was a case of a volunteer teacher's abuse of a student and the resulting bullying and cover-up. The sheriff is conducting an investigation. The volunteer teacher is no longer at the school and his wife, a teacher at the school, has resigned and the school has hired a lawyer. In the mean time, the RE-2 board agreed to renew Guffey's charter school contract and let the investigation go on.

The meeting was adjourned at 6:45 pm.
